

Faustin-Archange Touadéra, President of the Central African Republic (CAR), arrived in Kigali this afternoon for a two-day working visit aimed at strengthening bilateral ties between the two nations.

Rwanda and CAR enjoy a longstanding partnership rooted in military, security, and economic cooperation. Rwanda has played a significant role in supporting CAR's stability, notably through the deployment of its troops under both UN peacekeeping operations and bilateral arrangements.
