

South Africa will kick off their TotalEnergies CAF African Nations Championship (CHAN) Pamoja 2024 campaign with a tough test against Algeria.

The two teams will meet in what promises to be an exciting opening match of the tournament, which will showcase Africa's top footballing talent.

With several key players who have excelled in domestic leagues, Algeria will bring a wealth of talent and determination to the pitch.

Algeria's Meziane, Ayoub Ghezala -are known for his specific strength and skill, or Soufiane Beyazid will be key in orchestrating his team's offense and providing defensive stability.

Key players to watch out for in the South African side are Relebohile Mofokeng - A dynamic attacking midfielder/winger at Orlando Pirates. Very young—born in 2004—and already making waves both at club and on the international scene.

The other is Thalente Mbatha - A defensive midfielder also at Orlando Pirates, who made an immediate impact on his national debut by scoring in a 2025 AFCON qualifier against Uganda.

Selaelo Rasebotja - A technically gifted midfielder nicknamed “Iniesta,” currently with Orlando Pirates. Developed through SuperSport United’s youth system and increasingly earning national recognition and

Both South Africa and Algeria are set to face additional challenges as the tournament progresses, but the opening match will set the tone for their respective campaigns. A victory for either team would provide a significant boost as they move forward in the tournament, with qualification to the knockout stages on the line.

In the other matches, Guinea and Uganda will face off for the first time at the TotalEnergies CAF CHAN in this Group C encounter in Kampala on Friday. Uganda lost 3:0 to Algeria in the opener.

Central African Republic suffered 4-2 heavy defeat to Burkina Faso while host Tanzania are on course for a place in the quarter-finals of CHAN following a hard-fought 1-0 win over Mauritania, thanks to a late strike from veteran defender Shomari Kapombe and Kenya takes on Angola.
