A new hub for business education opened in Kigali on Saturday, promising to equip Rwandans with practical skills to grow enterprises and strengthen the economy.

The Hubbard College of Administration (HCA) Kigali held its inauguration at Century Park Hotel, welcoming government officials, business leaders, educators, and international partners. Organizers called the campus a milestone in Africa's push for ethical, practical, and sustainable management.
