With variations in pace, accuracy, and intelligent field placements, Kenya's bowlers showed their mastery over conditions, ensuring they remained in control from the first ball to the last.

Khagoitsa's efforts earned her the Player of the Match award, not only for her role in Kenya's clinical bowling performance but also for setting the tone for the team's approach in this crucial stage of the qualifiers.

As Kenya prepares to face Sierra Leone on Thursday, August 22, they will be looking to maintain this momentum, with their bowlers once again expected to play a pivotal role.
