

The Kirehe District leadership has called for strengthened collaboration with development partners to enhance service delivery and achieve the district's 2024-2025 performance contracts (Imihigo). As part of this effort, more than 28,000 residents have been urged to pay their community-based health insurance (Mutuelle de Santé) within three weeks to ensure continued access to healthcare services.

During a Joint Action Development Forum (JADF) meeting, Eng. Cyprien Sebikwe, Chairperson of JADF Kirehe, applauded the contributions of development partners and encouraged them to remain active participants in the district's development goals. He emphasized the importance of aligning efforts with the second phase of the National Strategy for Transformation (NST2).
