

President Paul Kagame opened a two-day cabinet retreat, colloquially known as Umwiherero, at the Intare Conference Arena in Rusororo, Gasabo this Tuesday afternoon.

Gathering cabinet members and top officials, the retreat aims to steer Rwanda's trajectory towards socioeconomic transformation.
