

Prime Minister Dr. Ngirente Edouard emphasized the Police's crucial role in maintaining national security during the graduation ceremony of new officers on December 13, 2024, at the Police Training School (PTS-Gishari) in Rwamagana District.

Families of the graduates also joined the celebration.
