

Egyptian side Pyramids FC got a first-leg advantage by holding APR to a 0-0 draw played in Kigali during the round of 32 clash in the CAF Champions League on Sunday.

This was Pyramids FC's inaugural appearance in the prestigious competition, marking a significant milestone for the club.

The hosts began the game brightly, creating two clear-cut opportunities within the first 25 minutes.

They also had a goal disallowed for offside just four minutes later. In response to their sluggish start, coach Jaime Pacheco made a substitution, introducing Burkinabe international midfielder Blate Toure at the expense of Ahmed Tawfik to bolster the midfield and gain better control over the game.

The first half ended with the scores at 0-0 though APR was a dominant force. The second half witnessed a noticeable improvement in Pyramids FC's performance as they asserted their dominance in terms of possession. However, they failed to pose a significant threat in front of goal.

The second leg is scheduled to take place in Cairo after a two-week period.
