

President Paul Kagame received Morocco's Foreign Minister, Nasser Bourita this evening, February 6, 2025, at Village Urugwiro. The meeting focused on deepening ties between Rwanda and Morocco. Minister Bourita also brought a special message from King Mohammed VI of Morocco.

According to the President's Office, the talks centered on ways to further enhance cooperation in different sectors.
