

Rwanda Development Board (RDB) this Friday night awarded eleven local businesses during the 6th edition of the RDB Business Excellence Awards.

The 2018 RDB Business Excellence Awards, held under the theme 'In pursuit of Business Excellence', celebrated efforts made by both corporate and small medium sized enterprises in Rwanda. Over 100 companies applied for the 2018 RDB Business Excellence Awards.
