

In a strategic meeting on January 22nd, Rwandan Defense Minister Juvenal Marizamunda and Mozambican Armed Forces Commander-in-Chief Admiral Joaquim Mangrassa solidified their countries' partnership in combating terrorism.

This two-day meeting underscores the commitment of both nations to regional security and their ongoing collaboration against insurgents in Mozambique's Cabo Delgado province.

Building upon existing ties, the discussion centered on bolstering cooperation in the fight against the terrorist threat.

Admiral Mangrassa emphasized the importance of perseverance and continued joint efforts until victory is secured.
