

Rwanda's military and police, working with other government institutions, have organized a series of activities aimed at improving community welfare and supporting development, scheduled to begin Monday, March 9, 2026.

The initiative will be carried out under the theme **“Partnership between citizens, the Rwanda Defence Force and the Rwanda National Police in activities marking Liberation Day 32.”**

The activities are part of annual efforts to promote the well-being of citizens ahead of Rwanda's Liberation Day celebrations, which take place every July 4.
