

The sixth edition of Women Deliver Conference, the world's largest multi-sectoral gathering to advance gender equality has started today in Kigali.

Inclusive and co-created spaces that foster solidarity for sustainable solutions on gender equality are high on the agenda of this conference.

Commenting on Rwanda hosting the conference Rwanda Development Board (RDB) CEO, Clare Akamanzi said, "I'm excited to welcome many delegates in Kigali this week, as they participate in the Women Deliver Conference. This is even more so, because the topic of gender equality and advancement is close to our country."

The conference that will end July 20 has attracted about 6,000 participants including high profile world leaders, women's human rights activists and members of the academia.
