

Kigali: Private sector CEOs, government ministers, dignitaries and leaders in the development sector in Rwanda came together in a landmark dialogue meeting where they resolved to strengthen their collaboration and support to women entrepreneurs in agriculture.

The platform creates an avenue through which women agribusinesses and those who support them can easily reach out to one another, share knowledge and access strategic resources and services.

VALUE4HER helps give women entrepreneurs the tools and information they need to grow their agriculture businesses and thus amplify their contribution towards sustainable development in Africa.", said AGRA President Dr. Agnes Kalibata while speaking at the event.
